Chapter Update Shippensburg University

As a new activity, the SU Math Club hosted a social hour immediately following the department's "New Math Major's Meeting" during the second week of classes. This was a great way for the active club members to meet our new freshman and transfer students. We have also organized our annual fall picnic for majors, and the SU SIAM Student Chapter welcomed almost a dozen teams from the region to participate in the 24-hour Fifth Annual Cumberland Valley Mathematical Modeling Challenge. As with many of our department events, student volunteers from the Math Club were essential to the success of these event. Later in the fall we will provide math activities for K-5 children of migrant workers as part of a university-side STEM outreach program.

Chapter Update Bryn Mawr College

This year we have two panel discussions planned: one about REU and other summer math experiences, and the other about career options for math majors. We will have several offcampus excursions to sectional meetings and to Gioia di Cari's production of "Truth Values: One Girl's Romp through MIT's Male Math Maze". In the spring we will organize a number of Math Awareness Week activities.

Chapter Update Ursinus College

Our chapter hosted several events open to the whole campus, including Sudoku Tournaments, Street Gambling like the 1600s, and Math Jeopardy, as well as social activities to welcome our majors and celebrate their achievements. For Halloween, the chapter is organizing "Trig and Treat" and is hosting a "The Math talk on of Zombies." We invited guest speakers to our Mobius-talks series, and we sponsored a trip to the National Museum of Mathematics MOMATH in



New York city (see photo) and we plan to organize another visit this spring 2014. Our students attended and participated at the JMM and the MAA-EPADEL meetings. We plan to host the 2014 American Mathematics Competitions ACM and sessions to help high school students prepare for SAT. In spring 2014, our chapter will help bringing to campus the show "Calculus: the Musical!"

Seven students participated in the tenth annual New Jersey Undergraduate Mathematics Contest at Felician College held in Spring 2013.

Chapter Update La Salle University

La Salle's MAA Student Chapter conducted a successful fundraiser and established a partnership with a local elementary school (St. Athanasius School in Philadelphia). Members of the chapter are looking forward to developing and conducting enrichment activities to share some exciting and challenging applications of mathematics with younger mathematicians. A "Bowling for Primes" event, with special mathematical scoring rules, is also planned.

Chapter Update East Stroudsburg

East Stroudsburg University's math club is Euclid's Elements. The club meets monthly to discuss topics in mathematics. One of our members, Danielle Williams, went to North Carolina State University for an REU summer program, studying Modeling and Industrial Applied Mathematics.

Chapter Update Kings College

King's junior math major students presented their "Axiom Systems" in the 2013 Spring EPADEL meeting held at Dickinson College on April 6th. All math majors must take a proof writing course in their freshman year at King's, and each student is assigned to create an axiom system as their final project in the course. They design their own axioms, and examine their consistency and independency of the models. Further, they make several theorems based on their axiom systems. As juniors, the students rework their axiom systems they made three years ago in order to give a public presentation such as at mathematics department colloquium or at an EPADEL meeting.

On April 20th, Math/CS club members participated as a volunteer in CEO (Commission on Economic Opportunity) in Wilkes-Barre. This multi-service nonprofit organization is governed by a Board of Directors comprised of three constituencies with equal representation: consumers, public sector, and private sector. Our task was to pack food in boxes to be distributed to senior citizens or people who struggle for economically.
