
Dear Colleague:

The members of the Iowa Section of the Mathematical Association of America are to elect a sectional governor of the association for a three year term beginning July 1, 1968 to succeed Professor D.W. Wall of the State University of Iowa. I have been asked to appoint a nominating committee for the section and to instruct them to report their nominations for governor to Raoul Hailbern, Associate Secretary of the Mathematics Association of America. The Association requests that the nomination be reported as promptly as possible. I am asking Professor D.W. Wall, Professor Donald E. Sanderson, and Professor B.E. Gillam to serve as a nominating committee for the section, with Professor Wall as chairman.

The by-laws of the association and actions taken by the Board of Governors provide that: (1) at least two nominations for sectional governor shall be submitted to the members of each section by the nominating committee appointed by the Chairman of the section. The nominating committee should select, as candidates for office, members who have demonstrated interest in the association. The committee should strive to select candidates who would be reasonably certain of attending meetings of the Board of Governors and would serve as an acting representative of the section on the Board of Governors. (2) Governors are eligible for re-election only after an interim of three years. (3) Governors shall be elected by mail vote to be conducted by the associate secretary of the association. (4) The territory included in the Iowa section is the state of Iowa.

I will ask Professor Sanderson and Gillam to contact Professor Wall directly. Thank you very much for serving the association in this way.
