Dear Professor Canfield:

On January 20, I wrote to Professor John M.H. Olmsted asking him to be our invited speaker for the April meeting. I told him that our section would expect to reimburse him, in part, for his services and expenses since NSF funds couldn't be used for this purpose.

Since he is now at the University of Iowa, I would assume that he would be considered a member of our section. I don't believe that we have paid section members for speaking in the past. Should we offer to pay him if he becomes our featured speaker? If so, how much?
