Possible topics already suggested are "Problems in the first two years of college teaching" and "The Role of Axiomatics and Problem Solving in Mathematics" from the CBMS-VSCMI pamphlet. If you would be willing to serve as a member of such a panel, be sure to let your Chairman know.

You will perhaps recall that members of the Association are invited to become members of the Iowa Council of Teachers of Mathematics. Dues are \$2.00 per year and may be paid to Frank Flickinger, Waverly, Iowa.

I will be happy to send membership application blanks to anyone you might suggest to me as a possible member of the Iowa Section of the MAA. Will you please be sure to give your early attention to the matters of the spring program.
