The 1996 **Iowa Collegiate Mathematics Contest** will be held on Saturday, March 30, from 10:00 am until 1:00 pm, at Iowa State University. The rules for the exam will be the same as last year:

- 1. The exam will consist of ten problems.
- 2. Students compete in teams of three. Each team submits one paper with solutions or partial solutions to any or all of the ten problems.
- 3. A school may enter more than one team of three students, but each team must compete separately.
- 4. The exams will be graded by Leo Schneider, author of the 1996 exam, and Elgin Johnston. Winning teams will be announced at the Spring meeting of the Iowa Section of the MAA.

While students are working on the contest, we will have a coaches meeting to discuss future contests. Some questions that may be discussed: Should we have small school and large school divisions? In the future, should the exam be mailed to each school so it can be taken on sight at a pre-set date and time? Where and how should future exams be scheduled?
