## CALL for PAPERS and PARTICIPATION

The 1999 Iowa Mathematics Meetings will be held April 16 and April 17 at The University of Iowa. The Iowa section of the MAA, the Iowa section of the ASA, and IMATYC are jointly conducting these meetings. The MAA speaker will be Colin Adams, the Mark Hopkins Professor and Head of the Mathematics Department at Williams College. He is a Polya lecturer for the MAA this year and received the Haimo Distinguished Teaching Award from the MAA last year. His book, "How to Ace Calculus: The Streetwise Guide", with Joel Hass and Abigail Thompson, has been as high as #62 on the *amazon.com* bestseller list. Professor Adams will lecture Friday night on "How to Make Calculus Fun." The Saturday morning talk will be "Real Estate in Hyperbolic 3-space: Investment Opportunities for the Next Millenium." The student paper sessions will be Friday afternoon while faculty papers will be presented Saturday afternoon. In addition there will be a social gathering Friday evening, a book exhibit Friday afternoon and Saturday, the business meeting Saturday morning and a luncheon on Saturday.

This letter is our call to you to submit abstracts of papers for presentation at the meeting. Papers in all areas are welcome. Rooms for faculty talks will have projectors. Some rooms will also have dual platform Macintoshes able to run Windows 95 and various software packages. Two computer labs will be available for special workshops or demonstrations. The Fifth Annual Iowa Collegiate Mathematics Competition will be held at Grinnell College on Saturday, March 13<sup>th</sup>. Lunch will be available afterwards, along with a talk for students by Marc Chamberland entitled "I have many problems".

It is anticipated that during the student competition, faculty will have the opportunity for informal conversation and/or there may be a lecture by a famous visiting mathematician.

As was the case in previous years, students will work in teams of three, and each team will submit one set of solutions to the contest problems. Each two-year college, four-year college, or university in the state of lower may enter as many 3-person teams as they wish.
