The 71st regular meeting of the Iowa Section, M.A.A. was held on the campus of Wartburg College, Waverly, Iowa on April 13 and 14, 1984. The meeting was held jointly with the Iowa sections of the Society for Industrial and Applied Mathematics and the American Statistical Association. The sessions were presided over by Chairperson-Elect Wayne Woodworth. There were 29 persons present on Friday, 25 of whom were members of the section. Of the 44 persons attending the Saturday sessions, 35 were MAA members. In total, 49 persons attended at least one of the sessions, including 37 members of the Iowa Section and one other MAA member.

The program arranged by Wayne Woodworth along with Arthur Gautesen of SIAM and Kenneth Koehler of ASA consisted of the contributed papers and invited addresses listed below as well as the Governor's report by Donald Meyer and the business meeting.

At the business meeting, presided over by Chairperson Lynn Olson, George N. Trytten of Luther College was elected to the office of Chairperson-Elect and Alan J. Heckenbach was chosen to be the new Secretary-Treasurer. The chairperson announced that during the year he had appointed George N. Trytten as Public Information Representative. It was also announced that the Executive Committee had decided to award the three student paper presentors free one-year memberships in the MAA or MAA-published books for those already members.

Professor Olson announced that he had been contacted by the Iowa Academy of Science with regard to meeting jointly with them again in the future. He pointed out that this would be a possibility since there were no conflicting dates with NCTM meetings in the next two or three years. Following some discussion, a resolution authorizing the Executive Committee to explore the resumption of joint meetings with the IAS was passed.

Appreciation was expressed to James Peake, the retiring Secretary-Treasurer and to outgoing chairperson Lynn Olson and Wartburg College for hosting the meeting.
