Fall 1996 Meeting: November 1–2 Hood College Meeting Announcement and Call for Papers

Less than an hour from Washington and Baltimore, Frederick is a charming, historic town with much to see and enjoy. It has a 33-block historic district, including buildings dating from the 18th and 19th centuries. There are several antique stores, a civil war battlefield, three covered bridges, and the Barbara Fritchie Museum. Also, there is a large park within walking distance of Hood College. Barbara Fritchie liked Frederick; so will you!

Hood College is a private institution known for its emphasis on the interaction between the liberal arts and sciences and professional studies, as well as for select post-graduate studies. Its lovely 50-acre campus is within walking distance of the downtown historic district.

Hood's Center for Science and Mathematics, integrating the departments of mathematics, chemistry, physics, and biology, was recently featured in Hood Magazine. The faculty in these departments meet regularly to discuss curricular issues, and sponsor speakers and other community outreach efforts. The article also mentioned that the math department is using the "discovery teaching" method, and including use of computers (primarily MathCad) in the courses. They have been involved in both Project Kaleidoscope and Duke University Project CALC (Calculus as a Laboratory Course). Perhaps they will share some of their experiences with us at the meeting.

The fall meeting will include a student poster session (see the call for posters inside), panel discussions on graduate school and business opportunities for our students, and an information session on the Distinguished Teaching Award. This is in addition to the usual invited speakers, workshops, contributed talks, book displays, and business meeting. See the fall newsletter for more details!

There are many places to stay in Frederick, and some deals have been made with several of them. Their locations relative to Hood College are indicated on the map below.


