From the Chair (Robert Roe)

2015 MAA Missouri Section Meeting

The 2015 Spring meeting of the Missouri Section of the MAA will be hosted by Missouri University of Science and Technology Department of Mathematics and Statistics. Presentations will be in the Butler-Carlton Civil Engineering Building while the Missouri Collegiate Mathematics Competitions and the banquet will be held in the Haverner Center on the campus of Missouri S&T.

The Missouri Collegiate Mathematics Competition will begin on the evening of Thursday, March 26, continuing on the morning of Friday, March 27. The conference will begin on the afternoon of Friday, March 27 and last until midday Saturday, March 28.

The plenary speakers are Steve Dunbar, University of Nebraska – Lincoln – "Olympiad Problems for Fun, Learning and Research with Dynamical Software", Angie Hodge – University of Nebraska – Omaha - "Inquiry-based learning: What, when, where, why, and how?" and Martin Bohner – Missouri S&T – The Beverton-Holt Quantum Difference Equation.

2015 is the centennial year for the MAA. The national offices have requested that we get plenty of pictures and video of activities at the section meeting to share at MathFest this coming summer. Those with ability and equipment are encouraged to help record memories of this meeting not only for the national meeting and also for our own future meetings.

Presentations

You are invited to present at the Spring Meeting. Presentations will be 15 minutes in length and may be on research topics of expository in nature, and may deal with any topic in mathematics or mathematics education. For example, papers may pertain to your current mathematical scholarly activity, new courses that you have developed, or successful techniques you have found useful in teaching. You may opt to design a presentation directed to the undergraduate and graduate students attending the meeting. Students are particularly encouraged to make presentations and faculty members are urged to assist student in presenting papers at the meeting.

If you would like to present at the meeting, submit your abstract through the conference website, or by emailing to <u>maa2105@mst.edu</u>. Please use "MAA abstract" in the subject line. Deadline for submissions of abstracts is March 16, 2015.

News from Section Officers meeting at the JMM

I attended the MAA Section Officers meeting at the Joint Math Meetings the past January in San Antonio, Texas. They were encouraging sections to plan something special at their section meetings to celebrate the centennial of the MAA. We have plans to had a Jeopardy contest at the section meeting where the answers will be from the history of the Missouri section so start studying! The MAA has created new section banners for each section. These will be on display at MathFest this summer and sections will be able to take their banner home afterwards.

Departmental MAA memberships will be changing in the future. With the purchase of departmental membership all of the department's undergraduate and graduate students will become student members of the MAA. I am not sure exactly when this will take place. There will be some increase in the cost of the departmental membership and the cost will also be based on the size of the department. The membership will come with electronic copies of MAA periodicals. Hard copies can still be purchased at an additional cost.

From the Governor (Susan Callahan)

The Board of Governors met on January 9, 2015, in San Antonio, Texas. During the course of the day we heard reports from MAA officers, MAA staff, and various committees and councils. We approved a large number of recommendations relating to committee issues. I will elaborate on some topics and list other actions.

Centennial Celebration

MathFest 2015 will be the MAA's centennial celebration meeting. The meeting will be four days long instead of three days and, along with the other usual lectures and addresses, will include six MAA Centennial Lectures in place of the typical three MAA Invited Addresses. Other events being planned include the Centennial Reception, a display of section flags, a showing of the centennial video, a vaudeville night, a music event and a theater event. MathFest 2015 will be held August 5-8, 2015, in Washington, DC. Also, a centennial publication will accompany the April issue of *Focus*.

<u>CUPM</u>

The printed version of the 2015 CUPM Curriculum Guide to Majors in the Mathematical *Sciences* will be published in early 2015. Some sections of the report are still in preparation but the rest are currently available online at <u>www.maa.org/cupm</u>.

Second Century Campaign

All members are encouraged to donate to the Greater MAA Fund as part of this campaign. Your support will help the MAA achieve its core goals. At the JMM it was announced that \$175,000

had been donated in 2014. Of the 51 governors, 29 have donated a total of \$19,600. The goal is to raise \$7,000,000 over a five-year period ending December 2016.

An Honor

The Carriage House (located behind MAA Headquarters in Washington, DC) was recognized by *Unique Venues* magazine as the "Best Venue to Meet with Fewer Than 100 People."

<u>Membership/Dues</u> 2016 dues for individual members were set as: \$249 for Member-Plus \$175 for Member (regular) This can be paid as a lump sum, or as 12 monthly installments of \$15, totaling \$180. \$35 for Student

The Board of Governors approved a new structure for departmental membership. The new departmental membership includes one full MAA membership, unlimited student memberships, and discounted WeBWork hosting for instructors in the department. The amount of dues a mathematical sciences department will pay depends on the institution's total enrollment and the department's PhD-granting status, as shown in the table:

Total Enrollment	Non-PhD Granting	PhD Granting
<7,000	\$500	\$750
7,000-19,999	\$700	\$1000
20,000+	\$900	\$1500

Before the vote for approval there was much discussion of this dues structure. Many Governors expressed concern that the fees were high and that no print journal was included. The dues structure was proposed by the Membership Committee and was intended to focus on and engage students.

Common Vision Project

Stakeholders in the mathematical sciences have developed a number of curricular guides. This project aims to find common themes and to articulate a shared vision for modernizing undergraduate mathematics. The common vision will be communicated to the mathematical sciences community. Work on a report for the project is underway. A draft of the report will be

revised, etc. at a workshop in May 2015. The Common Vision project is organized by the MAA and supported by the National Science Foundation.

Committee Restructuring

The Board approved replacing three committees (Personnel; Compensation; Management, Evaluation, and Oversight) having similar membership and related responsibilities with just one committee. The charge of the new Committee on Personnel combines the charges of the previous three committees. Its members will the Treasurer (chair), the President, and either the President–Elect or the immediate Past President.

The Board of Governors also:

- approved the minutes of the August 6, 2014 Board Meeting
- ratified the election of applicants to membership in the MAA
- approved the awarding of Meritorious Service Awards to the candidates nominated by six sections
- approved presenting the Mary P. Dolciani Award to Sybilla Beckmann at MathFest 2015
- approved presenting Henry L. Alder Awards to Allison Henrich, Patrick Rault, and Talithia Williams at MathFest 2015
- approved a revised charge for the Membership Committee
- approved a revised charge for the MAA-NCTM Committee on Mutual Concerns
- approved revising the membership of the Council on the Profession by adding an at-large position for inclusion
- approved a revised charge for the Committee on Technologies in Mathematics Education

Missouri Collegiate Mathematics Competition (Curtis Cooper)

The nineteenth Missouri Collegiate Mathematics Competition will be held 7:30pm - 10:00pm, Thursday, March 26, 2015, and 8:30am - 11:00am, Friday, March 27, 2015 on the campus of the Missouri University of Science and Technology.

Any college or university in the state of Missouri can send up to two official teams of 1-3 undergraduates each to compete in the competition. Unofficial teams will be allowed, depending on the amount of available space, but will not be eligible for awards. They will also be charged the normal registration fee. A one-person team will be allowed if this person is his or her college's only representative in the competition. A completed registration form for each team must be received by Monday March 23, 2015. Late registration will be accepted only if there is room available. No calculators or computers or reference material can be used during the competition. The contest consists of challenging mathematical problems, comparable to but not quite as difficult as the Putnam Exam.

Project NExT (New Experiences in Teaching) is a national program of the MAA (Mathematical Association of America) for new or recent doctorates in the mathematical sciences who are interested in improving the teaching and learning of undergraduate mathematics. The project aims to facilitate the professional development and integration into the profession of new mathematicians through a series of workshops and communication. The Missouri Section of Project NExT was set up in 2008, and has the additional goal of establishing links between the different types of institutions in Missouri and between graduate students and new faculty members in Missouri.

We are looking for volunteers to serve as mentors for our 2015 fellows. It is important for new faculty to receive one-on-one mentoring through their early years in order to grow professionally and succeed in their applications for promotion and tenure.

A mentor will be expected to keep in touch with their mentee throughout the year to provide guidance, perspective, encouragement and support. Fellows will be assigned mentors outside their institutions.

To become a mentor you should be a mathematics professor at a Missouri institution with tenure or at least six years of experience at an institution that does not grant tenure.
