Dr. David Marshall

The recipient of the 2018 Sr. Stephanie Sloyan Award for Distinguished Service from the New Jersey section of the Mathematical Association of America is Professor David Marshall of Monmouth University.



David has made important contributions to the New Jersey section for more than a decade. He was a member of the MAA-NJ's Executive Board from 2007-2016, serving as its Program Editor from 2007-2009, its Workshop Coordinator from 2009-2015, and its Vice-Chair for Innovations from 2014-2016. He has been a consultant for NJ-NExT since 2007 and served on two NJ-NExT panels.

David is currently a mentor for early career mathematicians through the MAA Mentoring Network and has served as a Project NExT consultant. He co-directed the 2008 MAA Professional Enhancement Program Workshop "Inquiry Based Learning with a Focus on Number Theory, a Transitions-to-proof Course." David has served on two MAA panels at the Joint Mathematics Meetings and as a judge five times for the MAA's Undergraduate Research Poster Session at the Joint Mathematics Meetings.

David earned his Ph.D. in Mathematics from the University of Arizona in 2000. Following positions at McMaster University and the University of Texas at Austin, he joined Monmouth University, where he has taught since 2004. David was an NJ-NExT fellow and is a member of the Mathematical Association of America, the Association of Mathematics Teachers of New Jersey, and the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics. He is currently serving his second term as a member of the Board of Education for the Township of Ocean in Monmouth County.

The section is very appreciative and grateful to David Marshall for his many contributions to MAA-NJ and the MAA.

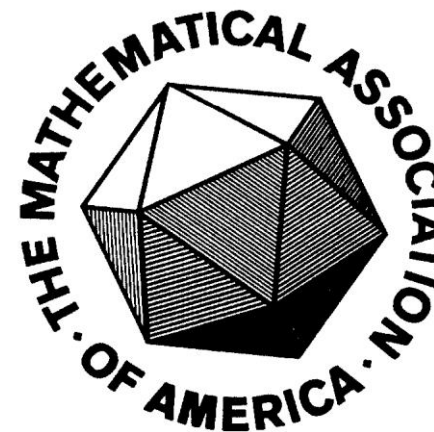
Response from Professor Marshall
