OK-AR SECTION of the MAA GENERAL BUSINESS MEETING (Virtual) April 8, 2022

Presiding: Ronald Smith, 2021-2022 Chair

1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 4:03 pm by Chair Smith.

2. Attendance

A quorum of greater than 20 members of the section was established by electronic means.

3. Approval of 2021 Business Meeting Minutes

The minutes for the 2021 General Business Meeting, recorded by Past-Secretary Rigsby, were made available for review though a link to a folder shared with business meeting participants. A motion to accept the minutes as written was made by Nicholas Zoller and seconded by Kristi Karber. The minutes were approved by an electronic showing of hands.

4. Financial Reports

A. Treasurer's Report – Kristi Karber

The report was presented by Section Treasurer Kristi Karber.

For 2021, the following balances, revenues, and expenses were reported:

(A) Beginning Bank Balances 12/31/2020	\$32,405.29
(B) Total Revenues	\$4,480.21
(C) Total Expenses	\$1,634.69
(D) Ending Bank Balances 12/31/2021	\$35,250.81

Treasurer Karber noted that the revenues included the MAA subvention and conference registration (including competition and workshop fees). The expenses included awards, postage, and Eventbrite costs. The Ending Bank Balance Total was broken down as follows:

Treasurer Karber noted that our Section made a slight profit last year due to the decreased expenses of a virtual meeting.

Nicholas Jacob moved to accept the treasurer's report as given, seconded by Andrew Wells. The report was approved.

B. *Audit Report

The audit report was inadvertently left off of the Business Meeting agenda. However, the audit was completed in February 2022 by Jeanine Myers, the preceding Past Chair of the Section, and was delivered to Chair Smith via email at that time. In her email, dated

2/14/22, Dr. Myers noted the following: "As past-past chair, I am responsible for the MAA financial audit. I am happy to inform you that after reviewing all the documentation and detailed notes that the MAA [Treasurer] Dr. Kristi Karber provided me, I find that the MAA financial records are accurate and in order."

5. Elections

Lakeshia Legette Jones presented the nominations from the Section Nominating Committee and presided over the elections. Votes were cast and counted by electronic means during the meeting. No additional nominations were made from the floor. Section Chair Smith noted that there was no N. A. Court Committee nominee on this year's ballot because the N. A. Court Committee does not have business to conduct this coming year. The following officers were elected unanimously:

- ii. 2nd Vice-Chair 2022-2023 Tulin Kaman, University of Arkansas.

6. Bylaws Updates / Vote on Bylaws Proposals – Sarah Marsh

Section Secretary Sarah Marsh reviewed the bylaws revision process to this point. A summary of major proposed changes was sent prior to the Section Meeting via MAA Connect and was also available in a shared online folder during the Business Meeting. These changes, if passed, will be submitted to the MAA's Committee on Sections for review / revision in the coming months. The OK-AR Section will vote on a final draft of the revised bylaws at the 2023 Section Meeting.

7. Vote on Bylaws Proposals

Three categories of changes from the circulated summary of changes were presented by Section Secretary Marsh and were voted on as follows:

- a. Section Officer Structure: Motion by Nicholas Jacob, second by Andrew Wells, passed with 20 of 24 votes.
- b. Committees: An amendment was proposed with the support of the Executive Committee that we include a Putnam Coordinator position in our bylaws. Motion by Kristi Karber, second by Andrew Wells. After some discussion, the (amended) motion passed with 18 of 24 votes.
- c. Minor Changes: Motion by Nicholas Zoller, second by Andrew Wells, passed with 18 of 24 votes.
