NARRATIVE

The Rocky Mountain Section requests a grant of \$500 to help finance the first section-sponsored short course in the Summer of 1986. The short course will be held on the campus of Fort Lewis College in Durango, Colorado. Dr. Ben Manvell, Mathematics Department, Colorado State University, has verbally agreed to present the short course on Discrete Mathematics (and he is enthusiastic about it!). We anticipate his fee to be approximately \$1000. The grant would be used to help pay for his fee.

The Section officers discussed the possibility of beginning sectionsponsored short courses last year and I agreed to pursue the idea. I
have talked to several governors from sections which presently sponsor
short courses and have received advice and information from Dr. Fusaro
of Salisbury State College who has been in charge of organizing the
short courses for the MD-DC-VA Section.

I feel there is a high probability that the short course (and short courses in the future) would be successful in the Rocky Mountain Section. At present, our section members do not have access to short courses at a reasonable distance from their homes.

With the successful beginning of short courses, we believe the section can continue short courses in the future without national MAA financial help.
