1. Due to requests from section officers, particularly those of larger sections, we have added a program to our micro computer that culls non-member reps from the rep mailing list and you will no longer have to cull duplicates by hand. Along with section membership labels, you will now receive labels for non-member reps only. If you are planning a mailing to reps only, you will have to make a special request for a complete list of rep labels.

The MAA reps list was reviewed against the general membership list and the present non-member status of the rep labels you will be receiving dates from August 25. I will be comparing the reps list against new member reports to keep the list up-to-date but if you notice any duplicates, please inform me.

2. Any section wishing to make a mailing to mathematics department chairs, here are some general guidelines. Department chair labels must be ordered from the AMS and the Washington office will cover the costs as long as they are being used in conjunction with section business. Chair labels are only run on Fridays so the turn around is approximately 2 weeks from the date I receive your request. Also, I must have a sample of your mailing to send to the AMS along with the label order; I cannot order labels without a sample. I am enclosing a mailing list grid that categorizes the labels according to type and number.

3. Section chairs and secretaries, if you have not yet done so, please appoint a section student chapter coordinator. A form and return envelop is enclosed for your use. The first student chapter mailing will be going out the third or fourth week in September to math department chairs, MAA reps, and section chairs, secretaries, and student chapter coordinators.

4. Section secretaries and newsletter editors who haven't sent in their label request order forms should do so.

5. Newsletter editors, enclosed for your use are two membership application forms, one of which is reduced to fit 1/2 of an 8" x 11" page.
