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**First Announcement of the Annual Spring Meeting**

The Annual Spring Meeting of the Rocky Mountain Section will be hosted by Fort Lewis College, Durango, Colorado on Friday, April 21 and Saturday, April 22, 1989. The Invited Speaker for the meeting will be Prof. Alan Schoenfeld, Associate Professor of Mathematics and Education and chairman of the Graduate Group in Science and Mathematics Education at the University of California, Berkeley. Prof. Schoenfeld's primary interests are in mathematical problem solving and in mathematics teaching in general. He is the author of Mathematical Problem Solving, Academic Press. He chairs the MAA Committee on the Teaching of Undergraduate Mathematics and is a member of the Committee on Computers in Mathematics Education. There is also a possibility that Robin Wilson will be visiting Colorado College in March and April and will be available for a guest lecture.

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## Short Course

Fort Lewis College in Durango, Colorado is sponsoring a two-week workshop on Data Base Management Systems to be held July 10-21, 1989. This short course, DBMS for Undergraduate College teachers, will be taught by Professor Gerry Litton of the University of San Francisco. Dr. Litton has extensive experience teaching graduate and undergraduate database management courses and is the author of several textbooks in the field. The objectives of this workshop are to provide participants with knowledge and materials to supplement existing undergraduate database courses and to develop new database courses at their home institutions. A basic background in computer science is expected of the participants. 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## American High School Mathematics Examination
