#### Second Announcement of the Annual Spring Meeting

The Annual Spring Meeting of the Rocky Mountain Section will be hosted by Fort Lewis College, Durango, Colorado on Friday, April 21 and Saturday, April 22, 1989. The Invited Speaker for the meeting will be Prof. Alan Schoenfeld, Associate Professor of Mathematics and Education and chairman of the Graduate Group in Science and Mathematics Education at the University of California, Berkeley. Prof. Schoenfeld's primary interestes are in mathematical problem solving and in mathematics teaching in general. He is the author of Mathematical Problem Solving, Academic Press. He chairs the MAA Committee on the Teaching of Undergraduate Mathematics and is a member of the Committee on Computers in Mathematics Education.

Other guest lecturers include Robin Wilson and John Fauvel of the Open University in London. Robin will present a guest lecture with the title "Early American Mathematics". John will give a pair of sessions on "Teaching History of Mathematics to 3000 Students".

## FORT LEWIS COLLEGE - SHORT COURSE DATABASE MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS

July 10-21, 1989

Fort Lewis College, Durango, Colorado

Dr. Gerry Litton, Associate Professor of Computer Science at the University of San Francisco will present the 1989 Fort Lewis College sponsored short course for Undergraduate College Teachers on Database Management Systems during the two weeks of July 10-21, 1989. The course will be held on the campus of Fort Lewis College. Professor Litton is the author of several texts in the field of database management including Introduction to Database Management - A Practical Approach and dBASE III Plus Hands-On - A Self-Guided Tutorial. His experience in the field of computer science spans 27 years including database design and implementation, microcomputer hardware and software and consulting primarily in the area of database management. Professor Litton received is PhD from the University of California at Berkeley in 1967 in Engineering Science and Mathematics. His teaching experience in computer science and particularly database management systems totals 14 years at the University of San Francisco, the University Extension Division at the University of California at Berkeley, Cabrillo Community College as Department Head of Business Data Processing, and Lecturer in the Institute of Computer Science at the University of Nairobi. He was employed at the Lawrence Berkeley Laboratory as a computer scientists for 13 years where he played a major role in bringing modern database management to the Laboratory.

The primary objectives of this short course are to provide participants with the knowledge necessary to supplement existing database courses and develop database management systems courses at their home institutions. There will be thirty (30) hours of in-class instruction on selected topics in the area of database management systems and the tools for teaching such topics at the undergraduate level. An additional twenty (20) hours will be devoted to instructions and discussion on specific database management system software packages which include dBASE III PLUS. Participants will have the opportunity to use these software packages on the Fort Lewis College computer facilities to complete assigned projects. Each participant will be provided copies of the above texts authored by Dr. Litton plus the text Introduction to Database Systems, Volume I by C. J. Date.

The course will begin with a wine-cheese social on Sunday, July 9, from 7:00 to 9:00 PM. Reservations have been made for those wishing to ride on the scenic narrow gauge train on July 15 - this is an all-day trip. A steak fry dinner is scheduled for one evening. For participants and dependents staying on campus, the use of tennis courts and an olympic-size swimming pool are free of charge. An 18-hole golf course is adjacent to the campus. Carts are available and green fees are reasonable.

The number of participants will be limited to 35, so send your completed application as soon as possible, but not later than May 31. Further information and registration forms can be obtained by contacting:
