#### **Call for Contributed Papers**

Individuals are invited to submit an abstract for 15 - 20 minute talks at the fall meeting. Talks should address on of the following topics: History of Mathematics, Teaching (modeling, technology, topics) and Analysis. Submissions for all contributed papers should contain: a title; an abstract (not to exceed one-half page and suitable for inclusion in the conference program); and desirable mathematical background of the audience.

# Join Southern California Section NExT!

Designed for new college and university faculty holding a masters or a doctorate in the mathematical sciences, Section NExT (New Experiences in Teaching) is a year-long professional development program that addresses the full range of faculty responsibilities including teaching, scholarly activities, and service.

We will accept applications from faculty who are within the first three years of beginning full-time employment with teaching responsibilities at the college or university level. The application consists of a short personal statement and a letter of support from the department chair.

A Section NExT fellow will be required to attend two one-day meetings of the Southern California Section of the MAA, the fall meeting on October 12, 2002, and the spring meeting on March 8, 2003. At each meeting there will be special activities for the Section NExT fellows. National NExT fellows are encouraged to participate in the Section NExT activities. # Students Almost Outnumber Faculty at Spring 2002 Meeting!

Ninety-six students and 104 faculty members attended the MAA Southern California Section Spring 2002 Meeting Saturday, March 16, at the California Institute of Technology (Caltech). Students and faculty enjoyed four very exciting talks on the mathematics of juggling, cake-cutting, voting, and "The Simpsons" TV show. They also enjoyed the annual Student Poster Session, in which 31 students presented 20 research projects.

#### **Spring 2002 Meeting Student Poster Session**

Thirty college students and one high school student presented 20 posters during the Student Poster Session at the MAA Southern California Section Spring 2002 Meeting Saturday, March 16, at Caltech. Meeting attendees kept student poster presenters busy answering questions about their posters throughout the one-hour session, held outdoors under mostly sunny skies. A team of judges, headed by Professor Mario Martelli of Claremont-McKenna College, awarded

first place to Adam O'Connor of the University of Redlands for his project, "Clasps and Stick Knots" (faculty advisor: Rolland Trapp, California State University, San Bernardino). Adam received a TI-89 graphing calculator and the Derive software package as prizes. Second place went to Tim Harding and Ann Monville of California Lutheran University for their project, "Minimum Value of a Rational Expression" (faculty advisor: Cynthia

Wyels, Cal Lutheran), while third place was awarded to David Gaebler and Robert Gaebler of Harvey Mudd College for their project, "A Combinatorial Approach to Hyperharmonic Numbers" (faculty advisor: Arthur Benjamin, Harvey Mudd College). The second and third place award winners each received a TI-89 graphing calculator or software from Wolfram Research. Honorable Mention was awarded to Michael Rowell of the University of San Diego (faculty advisor: Jeffrey Wright, USD), Bradley Marchand and Alexander Todd of California State University, Bakersfield (faculty advisor: Kamel Haddad, Cal State Bakersfield), and Melanie Lee of UCLA (faculty advisor: John Westman, UCLA). Honorable Mention winners received a book or Tshirt. All poster presenters received a free one-year MAA membership, including a subscription to one of the MAA journals, or, for those who already were MAA members, a free MAA book.

All 20 posters were excellent, giving meeting attendees a lot to think about and giving the judges an especially difficult task. Thank you to all student poster presenters and to their

faculty advisors for working so hard on their projects and posters. Thank you also to the faculty members who judged the Student Poster Session.

California Lutheran University had the largest number of student poster presenters, with ten students presenting five posters. Five students from Bakersfield College presented four posters, while five students from California State University, Bakersfield, presented two posters. Special thanks to Professor Cynthia Wyels of California Lutheran University and to Professor Rebecca Head of Bakersfield College for bringing large groups of students to the meeting and for serving as faculty advisors for several posters. Heba Hathout of the Westridge School for Girls was the lone high school student poster presenter, presenting a project she had completed under the direction of Professor John Woo of UCLA.

Also at Caltech: Rahul Pandharipande has resigned to accept a position at Princeton. Danny Calegari (UC Berkeley Ph.D., 2000) starts this July as Assistant Professor, Alexei Borodin (UPenn PhD., 2001; Clay Fellow) starts in April 2003 as Professor and Vadim Kalogin (Princeton Ph.D., 2000; AIM Fellow) starts in April 2003 as Associate Professor.

We were sad to learn that *University of California Irvine* lost two professors emeritus recently: **Gerhard K. Kalisch** passed away on August 26, 2000 and **William F. Donoghue**, **Jr.** passed away on April 4, 2002. Also, **Hongkai Zhao** was awarded a Sloan Foundation Fellowship and **Daqing Wan** was awarded a Silver Medal of Mathematics from the Morningside Foundation.

**Peter Li** and **Svetlana Jitomirskaya** are invited speakers at the International Congress of Mathematicians in Beijing, August 2002. Professor **Bernard Russo** was appointed to a three year term as chair of the department on July 1, 2001.

Pepperdine University is pleased to announce that Randall Maddox has been promoted to Full Professor, and that Kendra Killpatrick has accepted a tenure-track position at the level of Assistant Professor. Kendra received her Ph.D. in combinatorics from the University of Minnesota in 1998, and has spent the last three years as a post-doc at Colorado State University.

Some *California State University San Marcos* tidbits: **Radhika Ramamurthi** will join the Department as Assistant Professor in the Fall. She held a Post-Doc position at UCSD for 2001-2002. Her area is graph theory. **Farshid Hajir**, on leave at University of North Carolina for 2001-2002, resigned to join the Department of Mathematics at the University of Massachusetts. The Department of Mathematics participated in the Collaborative Aca-

demic Preparation Initiative (CAPI) program in AY2001/02. **Linda Holt** is the Director of this program. It aims for collaboration between CSUSM mathematics faculty and local high school mathematics teachers in a variety of ways to help to reduce the need for remediation for incoming California State University students.

News from Harvey Mudd College: Jon
Jacobsen joins them as an Assistant Professor, having completed a postdoc at Penn State. Jon did his undergraduate work at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo. Naomi Cameron has a 2-year visiting appointment. She received her PhD from Howard University this year. Mike
Moody is taking a leave of absence to become Dean of Faculty at Olin College in Boston. Art Benjamin will serve as acting chair while the math department searches for a new chair this year.
