MAA National News Board of Governors Report

The Board of Governors of the MAA met for its usual daylong meeting on 3 January 2012 in Boston, MA, prior to the Joint Mathematics Meetings. One of the action items at this meeting was the approval of the 2013 dues: \$199 for the regular rate (a \$5 increase) with *The Monthly*, \$179 with either *CMJ* or *Mathematics Magazine*; \$194 e-membership (which includes all three journals); regular discounted rates are 20% less; retired rates are 50% less than regular rates; undergraduate and graduate student rates will be \$32. Currently, about 27% of regular, regular-discounted, and retired members hold e-memberships; it's over 96% with student members.

In other matters the Board approved recommendations that were contained in the final report of the Strategic Planning Working Groups on SIGMAAs. The upshot of the recommendations was to ensure better alignment among the fees charged to be part of a SIGMAA, the costs involved in running a SIGMAA, the benefits to the members of the SIGMAA, and the benefits to the greater mathematics community and to the mission of the MAA. Also, changes in committee charges were approved, many of them dealing with financial-(continued on next page)

related committees to ensure that timely financial decisions can be made, especially given the volatile economic environment in which we continue to live.

Further, guidelines for the Haimo Award for Distinguished College or University Teaching of Mathematics were modified to allow a Section nominee for the award to be the current recipient of the Section Award for Distinguished Teaching or a previous recipient of such an award. The change also allows the previous award to have been given by a Section other than the one submitting the current nomination. Guidelines for the Alder Award were modified so that exceptions to the 7-year limit since receiving a Ph.D. could include maternity, paternity, family, or medical leaves. And, the minimum award for the Euler Book Prize was increased from \$1,000 to \$2,000.

This is my last official report as Governor of the Southwestern Section. I greatly appreciate the opportunity that I've had to serve our Section in this capacity. Currently, the election process for a new governor is underway. We have two great candidates on the ballot: Anne Dudley from Glendale Community College and William Y. Velez from the University of Arizona. The next Board meeting will be on 1 August 2012 in Madison, WI, prior to MathFest, where the new Governor will be seated. — *Tom Gruszka, WNMU*
